OUR COMMUNITY PARTNERS:

United Way works with local nonprofits to address the roots of significant issues in the Concho Valley. This collaborative effort allows us to wrap our efforts around a problem and tackle it from many angles, producing measurable outcomes that are changing lives in our community.



The Alcohol & Drug Abuse Council for the Concho Valley (ADACCV) provides detox, residential and outpatient treatment for substance use disorders in males and females who are mostly indigent, at times homeless, and who cannot afford private-pay treatment facilities.

Services provided include specialized female treatment services for pregnant women and women with children. Detox and residential treatment services are provided at the Journey Recovery Center. This facility opened in March 2020 and has 12 detox beds and 60 residential treatment beds. ADACCV provides services to clients from throughout the Concho Valley and also serves clients from across the state.

Court Appointed Special
Advocate (CASA)

Children's Advocacy Center of Greater West Texas, Inc serves a thirteen county region between three main programs of Hope House, Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA), and Family Services. Hope House provides services to children and families and works to minimize the trauma a child may encounter during interviews following an abuse allegation. Hope House conducts forensic interviews of child victims, provides therapy services, education and care management, court preparation support, and family advocate services. CASA provides children in crisis, whose home is determined by a court of law, with a friend of the court, social service, referrals, and court preparation. Family Services offers development and support to families including support groups and classes.

Stay in School to Enjoy Real Success (SISTERS) seeks to decrease the dropout rate among girls in the San Angelo Independent School District. Programming incorporates the Girl Scouts curriculum with four key Texas Education Agency dropout prevention strategies. The program's comprehensive approach improves girls' self-esteem, helps girls overcome barriers to high school graduation, develops girls' ability to navigate important life decisions and overcome future challenges, and builds girls' leadership skills. SISTERS currently serves girls at six SAISD schools, the Concho Valley Home for Girls, and the Boys and Girls Clubs of San Angelo.
